Working Men's Club

Working Men's Clubs are Societies formed for purposes of Social Intercourses, mutual helpfulness, mental and Moral improvement and rational recreation.

Incorporation

On registration a society shall, ipso facto, become and be a body corporate by the name described in the acknowledgement registration and subject to the rules of the society.

The name of a registered society shall be engraved on its common seal.

Application for Registration

Where any number of persons not less than seven have established or intend to establish a society to which the act (Chapter 36:04 Friendly Society Act) applies, they shall make applications in writing to the Registrar of that purpose.

- The application shall be signed by at least seven members, including the secretary;
- Three copies of the rules and list of names of officers, shall be transmitted to the Registrar together with the application.

Registration of Societies

- ❖ No society shall be registered under a name identical with that under which any other existing society is registered, or so nearly resembling that name as to be likely, or under any name likely, in the opinion of the registrar, to deceive the members or public as to its nature or its identity.
- ❖ No society shall change its name without the sanction of the Registrar as hereinafter provided.

Objectives of Working Men's Club

- 2) To maintain a high level of performance in competitions and events.
- 3) To include club infrastructure in order to enhance their ability to grow and develop.
